## Child

We believe all children are unique, capable and competent and that children learn in their own time and way. Educators maintain high expectations for children and ensure that each child's successes are valued and celebrated in their learning and development. We ensure children have opportunities to try new things, take risks, make mistakes and are free to explore, experiment and discover things that extend their knowledge. We believe children learn best through play and discovery and through being actively involved in their learning. We believe encouraging independence will ensure strong foundations for lifelong learning.Educators establish and prioritise warm, positive and trustworthy relationships with all children.

## Educator

Educators encourage respectful and socially just practices and advocate for the rights of children. Our curriculum reflects the needs of the individual and the group and value's each child's background, culture, interests and strengths. Educators value and intentionally plan opportunities for children to understand Australia's cultural diversity and embed Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander perspectives in the curriculum. Collaborative teaching opportunities are explicitly planned to inspire a love of learning and help children learn about themselves and their environment. We view children's experiences at Jamboree Community Kindergarten as the beginning of their lifelong learning journey outside of the home and strive for children to transition to school confidently and happily. Our committed educators promote and value ongoing professional development, learning and reflective practices to ensure continuous improvement and review our staffing models frequently to reflect the needs of our ever changing and growing community.

## Environment

We view the Jamboree Community Kindergarten environment as the third teacher, which promotes relationships, communication, collaboration and exploration. Materials are thoughtfully and purposefully included which promote creativity, thinking, problemsolving skills, questions, experimentation, and openended play. We strive to provide a happy, safe, fun, nurturing, relaxed and enriched environment. We support children to develop positive dispositions for learning such as being curious, confident, resourceful, cooperative, persistent and taking risks. We value our natural and spacious outdoor environment, and our Bush Kindy program recognizes that children benefit and need opportunities to connect to the natural world. We are proud of our purpose-built, accessible to all, Kindergarten which is regularly maintained to a high standard. We value the importance of a sustainable future and are committed to embedding the shared responsibilities of sustainable practices between educators, children and families into our curriculum.
